The Appalachian Learning Alliance, which began in 1999, is a partnership between Appalachian State University and ten community colleges located in western North Carolina. The mission of the Alliance is to:

1. Increase access to high quality education and learning for North Carolinians,
2. Expand educational offerings through a variety of collaborations and educational resourcefulness,
3. Share educational assets to deliver cost-effective learning programs and courses of study to a wide range of citizens,
4. Expand outreach and public service initiatives in communities throughout the region, and
5. Add value to North Carolina's existing higher education resources.

Appalachian Learning Alliance programs are often cohort-based, a term used to describe a group of students seeking the same educational goal who begin a program of study together at a particular site and proceed term-by-term in a lock-step fashion to acquire the necessary courses. Because of this uniqueness, students are able to enter the off-campus program only at certain times and applications for admission are accepted at selected intervals.

It is important that an individual applying to an Appalachian off-campus undergraduate program know the name of the off-campus cohort/program they are seeking to enter and the time frame for application submission. For purposes of this application all Appalachian majors are listed within the code pages (E and F); however, not all of these majors are available in the off-campus programming.

### FILING APPLICATION FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION

Complete all applicable sections (front and back) of the application. Responses should be typed or legibly printed in ink. An application cannot be acted upon unless all items are either answered or designated as not applicable (N/A). Please remember to sign and date the application.

### RACE/ETHNIC CLASSIFICATION

Completing this section of the application is not required. The information requested here will only be used for statistical and federal reporting purposes.

### SUBMISSION OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (on Page G)

Disclosure of your Social Security number is mandatory for purposes of reporting qualified tuition and related expenses pursuant to IRS requirements, and for purposes directly related or reasonably necessary to the accomplishment of those reporting requirements – See IRS Forms 1098-T and W-9S; 26 U.S.C. 6109; 26 U.S.C. 6050S. The only students excepted from this requirement are those: (1) who are enrolled only in courses for which no academic credit is offered; (2) who are nonresident alien students who do not want the University to prepare a Form 1098-T for them; (3) whose qualified tuition and related expenses are entirely waived or are paid entirely with scholarships or grants; or (4) for whom the University does not maintain a separate financial account, and whose qualified tuition and related expenses are covered by a formal billing arrangement between the University and the student's employer or a government entity.

In addition, if you apply for and receive federal financial aid, or if you are employed by the University, you must provide your Social Security number for the following purposes:

## ADMISSION DECISIONS

### All Applicants

The University of North Carolina system has established minimum high school course requirements (MCRs), listed below.

For high school graduates of 2006 and beyond:

A high school diploma; **four course units in English; two course units of a language other than English; four course units in mathematics** (including Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, and a higher level course for which Algebra II is a prerequisite; fourth math courses include AP Calculus, AP Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Discrete Mathematics, IB Mathematics Level II, Integrated Mathematics IV, and Advanced Functions & Modeling); **three course units in science** (including at least one unit in a life or biological science area, at least one unit in a physical science area, and at least one laboratory science); **two course units in social studies** (including one unit in U.S. History).

Applicants who are at least 24 years of age may be exempted from the University of North Carolina Minimum Course Requirements.

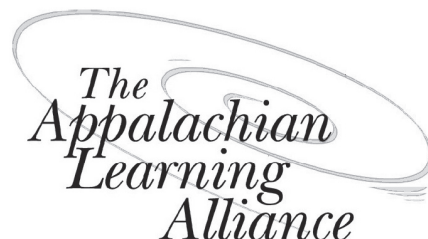
### Transfer Admissions

Transfer students must meet the minimum course requirements (see listing above) and have at least 30 semester hours of transferable work and a 2.0 overall college grade point average (as calculated by Appalachian).

**Applications will be considered on a space-available basis. It is important to submit your application as soon as possible following notification that applications are being accepted in order to avoid any possible waiting lists. Decisions cannot be made on incomplete applications.**

Applicants who do not meet the minimum course requirements in high school must complete one of the following:

- CAA core;
- Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Fine Arts degree; or
- Six semester hours of transferable course in each of the following areas: English; mathematics (business-related math courses do not meet the requirement); natural science (biology, chemistry, geology, physical science, physics); social science (anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, sociology); and a second language (for high school graduates of 2004 and beyond).



## NONDEGREE, VISITING, AND TEACHER LICENSURE APPLICANTS

Applicants must submit a completed application and nonrefundable \$50 application fee. Official transcripts from college(s) previously attended are recommended for applicants in the nondegree and visiting categories. This classification may be used only by individuals who do not plan to receive degrees at Appalachian. The course work cannot be used as a basis for admission to undergraduate degree programs. Students seeking teacher licensure should have an approved **Alternative Teacher Licensure Form** on file in the Reich College of Education in addition to submitting an undergraduate application. Teacher licensure applicants should contact the Office of Extension and Distance Education to discuss submission of official college transcripts for eligibility and evaluation purposes.

**Visiting students should confer** with their home institutions to determine if course work completed at Appalachian will transfer. Nondegree applications are accepted on a space-available basis and enrollment in particular off-campus courses is not guaranteed.

Nondegree students may take a maximum of 18 hours each semester. Because this classification is designed for students taking courses purely for their edification, academic advisors are not assigned. Nondegree students are encouraged to obtain the *Student Handbook of Rights and Responsibilities* from the Center for Student Involvement and Leadership.

Applicants who are not accepted as degree-seeking freshmen, transfers, or graduate students are not eligible for nondegree status. Individuals wishing to take graduate course work as nondegree or visiting students must apply and be admitted through the Office of Graduate Studies and Research.

### APPLICATION CHECKLIST

**A complete application includes the following:**

- The completed application form with a non-refundable \$50 check or money order** made payable to Appalachian State University. Please include the applicant's name on the check. There is a \$25 service charge for returned checks.
- An official copy of your high school transcript that includes grades 9 through 12. Transfer applicants are required to submit an official high school transcript.**
- College transcripts.** You must contact the Registrar's Office at each institution you have attended and request that official transcript(s) be sent to the Office of Extension and Distance Education, Appalachian State University, ASU Box 32054, Boone North Carolina 28608-2054. Complete the *College Courses in Progress* form and return it with your application if you are currently enrolled in courses or plan to take courses prior to entering Appalachian. Students must have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average on all transferable college course work (as computed by Appalachian).
- The application form must be completed in full (Pages B through G), signed and dated** or it will be returned to the applicant.
